<u>Baker Commodities</u>: Negotiations have been put on hold for the time being. Due to the unforeseen circumstances, the Company and the Union have agreed to extend the contract for forty (45) days.

<u>Merrimack Valley Distribution</u>: We had a member who was removed from the seniority list back in December. An arbitration hearing was held between the parties on April 3rd via the zoom platform. The post hearing briefs are due back on Friday, May 1st. I would like to thank Steward Wayne Berthold and Alternate Steward Mark Travers for their help.

<u>Rand Whitney (Assemblers)</u>: In what seems to be the common theme associated with the Coronavirus precautions that are in place negotiations with the Company have been put on hold for the time being. I am hopeful those negotiations will be starting soon whether they be face-to-face or via an alternative platform.
